WPDI GALA

On **September 27, 2024**, in **New York City**, Forest Whitaker hosted the Faces of Hope Gala, paying tribute to WPDI's extraordinary work empowering young people and communities around the world affected by conflict. The evening offered a platform for meaningful exchange and a call for increased support to further the mission of building lasting, sustainable peace. Since its founding in 2012, WPDI has pioneered an innovative approach by mobilizing young people to lead peacebuilding and development efforts within their communities.

The Gala brought together an exceptional array of guests from a wide range of sectors, including representatives from the United Nations, corporate leaders, civil society advocates, and distinguished figures from the arts. The evening's program featured speeches from WPDI's partners, an engaging Fireside Chat with Forest Whitaker and WPDI Executive Director, Caroline Descombris, **powerful Youth Peacemakers' stories**, and a show-stopping performance by YG Marley. These heartfelt performances precipitated profound reflections on WPDI's significant impact over the past 12 years.



A Fireside Chat with WPDI Founder, Forest Whitaker and Executive Director, Caroline Descombris

WPDI's founder, Forest Whitaker and Executive Director, Caroline Descombris participated in a fireside chat hosted by Whoopi Goldberg. The discussion offered an intimate look into the core of WPDI's mission, its evolution over the past 12 years, and its ambitious vision for the future.

Forest Whitaker shared personal reflections on how his passion for peacebuilding began during his time working in conflict-ridden areas, notably after filming "The Last King of Scotland" in Uganda. He recalled meeting people whose lives were shattered by war and violence, which solidified his belief that peace is not just the absence of conflict but a skill that can and must be taught and nurtured. His journey, he explained, led to the creation of WPDI with a focus on empowering young people to transform their communities from within. Whitaker spoke about the importance of inner peace, emphasizing that real, lasting peace must begin within individuals before it can ripple outward to communities and nations. He discussed WPDI's unique approach of training Youth Peacemakers, who not only earned the skills of conflict resolution, but also become agents of change in their communities, inspiring others to join them on the path to peace.

Caroline Descombris, who has been an integral part of WPDI's since it's beginning shared insights into the organization's growth and the challenges we face in conflict-affected areas. She spoke about the critical role of partnerships in advancing WPDI's mission, as well as the personal stories of transformation she has witnessed through the organization's programs.

Together, Whitaker and Descombris discussed the organization's reach, which now spans nine countries, and the significant impact WPDI has had on the lives of nearly 2 million people, many of whom are women and children. Our Executive Director highlighted how WPDI's programs have provided not only peace education but also vocational training, trauma-healing, and support for entrepreneurship, building resilience in communities often devastated by decades of conflict.

The Fireside Chat concluded with a message of hope and a call to action. **Both** emphasized that while the challenges of peacebuilding are immense, the dedication of WPDI's partners, supporters, and youth leaders proves that peace is achievable one community, one youth leader, and one act of compassion at a time.

The Roundtable featured:

Joseph Dusuman John Ginana

Born in South Sudan, Joseph experienced the turmoil of the 2013 and 2016 conflicts. After moving to Juba in 2018, he began to work as a porter but soon joined WPDI in 2019. Trained in Conflict Resolution, Entrepreneurship, and ICT, Joseph has since become a Youth Peacemaker, using his skills to bring positive change to his community.

Evelyn Laruni

Hailing from Northern Uganda, Evelyn brings over 17 years of experience in peacebuilding. As WPDI's Country Coordinator for Uganda, she has dedicated herself to fostering peace, guiding youth, and supporting sustainable development efforts in conflict-affected areas.

Khadija Mayman

Growing up in Bonteheuwel, Cape Town, Khadija transformed her experiences with violence into a lifelong mission for peace. Starting as a Youth Peacemaker in 2019, she is now a Conflict Resolution Trainer for WPDI, where she empowers young people to build resilient communities.

Valentina Villarreal

A student at California State University, Long Beach, majoring in pre-psychology, Valentina became involved with WPDI in 2023. She introduced the Domestic Harmonizer Program to her high school, promoting conflict resolution and mental health advocacy among her peers.
