On September 27, 2024, taking opportunity of the International Day of Peace and the Opening Week of the United Nations General Assembly, WPDI will hold a gala Dinner and Auction in New York to celebrate twelve years of action for peace from the grassroots.



The Whitaker Peace & Development Initiative

Forest Whitaker created WPDI to help young women and men address the challenges of their community in places plagued by endless cycles of armed violence, poverty and exclusion. Too often, we view these contexts solely as backgrounds for deplorable stories of victims and perpetrators of violence. But Forest had learnt a different story.

Throughout his life, he had met with and listened to youths who had been drawn into violence, sometimes as gang members or child soldiers. For many, the stories of their lives had started in utter darkness. But, for most of them, this was not the end of their story as they saw it. They had different, luminous narratives in mind. They refused to be the subjects of narratives imposed on them – they wanted to take the lead, drive change and transform their communities into better places.

WPDI is the vehicle that Forest created to give them tools and resources to craft and enact new stories of and on their own. Since 2012, with programs in Cameroon, Chad, Gabon, Mexico, South Africa, South Sudan, Uganda and the United States, WPDI has reached more than 1,500,000 people by providing them opportunities to learn new skills, access the internet, address conflicts in their communities, or establish businesses. We have helped them drive the narrative of their lives.

However, with over 600 million youth living in conflict- and violenceaffected locations around the world, where so many women are victimized or neglected despite their immense potential, the task ahead is immense. So is our ambition. By the end of the next decade, our goal is to have reached over 3 million people, contributing to spark a global movement that will help to bring forth, in the too many communities trapped in cycles of conflict and fragility, new faces of hope.



Our approach is rooted in the belief that the best strategy to assist communities enduring prolonged conflict, poverty, and fragility is to help them help themselves, empowering them to improve their capacity for peace, sustainability, and resilience.

VECTORS OF CHANGE

We create networks of Youth Peacemakers whom we train and support to lead change in the areas where we operate. Initiating educational, entrepreneurial, and cultural projects on the ground, they serve as transformative insiders.

FOUR PILLARS OF ACTION

PEACEBUILDING

Ourpeacebuilding approach focuses on empowering grassroot initiatives and involving local communities. We mediate conflicts, promote peace values, and teach conflict resolution skills to community members, including leaders, students, and teachers, fostering a partnership with beneficiaries to promote peace in their communities.

HEALTH & WELLBEING


In areas plagued by chronic violence and poverty, individuals experience trauma and psychosocial distress. Our healthcare programs provide trauma healing services and address issues such as sexual and reproductive health. We also raise awareness about the significance of these issues for individual wellbeing and community resilience. Our Community Learning Centers, established in underserved areas, provide access to resources such as knowledge, employability skills, connectivity, and startup capital grants, empowering individuals to drive change in their communities.

LIVELIHOOD

Our mission prioritizes fostering economic resilience and independence through vocational training, startup grants, and incubation services. These initiatives not only benefit individuals directly by creating job opportunities and supporting businesses but also contribute to the overall prosperity and vibrancy of their communities.

SPORTS

Sporting activities provide avenues for initiating dialogue, fostering acceptance, and resolving conflicts. Our Peace Through Sports program connects children, youth, and communities, instilling values of mutual respect, inclusion, and fair play. This initiative aims to integrate a culture of peace into the daily lives of individuals and communities.





UGANDA

Emad Rajab Said fled the war in South Sudanand found refuge in the Kiryandongo Refugee Settlement, where he joined WPDI at the age of 20. Since then, he has become one of our best Youth Peacemakers.

Today I train and teach peace in schools, in the community and even in the media. I feel confident whenever addressing people locally or in international forums. UNITED STATES



Santino was an 8th grade student at Ball Jr. High School when WPDI first began its partnership with the school. He was an active member and participant of WPDI's peer mediation program.

SOUTH AFRICA

Khadija Mayman joined WPDI in 2019 when she was 23 years old. She started as a Youth Peacemaker, and in 2021 she joined the staff team as a Conflict Resolution trainer.

In September of 2021, I was employed by WPDI as a Conflict Resolution Trainer and it has been one of my greatest achievements. I am grateful that I get to work in a space that allows me to learn, grow and strengthen my ability to be an effective trainer. I'm able to learn from the rest of the team every day. But I also get to positively contribute to my community through my trainings.



MEXICO

Víctor Sántiz is a Youth Peacemaker from San Cristóbal de Las Casas. In 2014 he registered for a training program with WPDI in Chiapas.

66 This experience marked a new path for me on social action. My transformation as a young peacemaker with WPDI has impacted many people beyond me. With my work, I have reached more than 900 people. The projects I work on improve their nutrition and food security, and guarantee a fair and sufficient income. I recognize the great potential of this initiative and now I seek to replicate the education I received by promoting the construction of a brand new Community Learning Center that will impact the lives of more than 120 youths in Mitontic.

FROM LOCAL STAKEHOLDERS

In 2017, right before our Youth Peacemakers started working at the Kiryandongo Refugee Settlement, the Office of the Prime Minister would record three to five weekly incidents of violence among tribes residing in the settlement. However, they have recorded only three incidents since January 2018.

66 This is amazing news for the communities living within and around the settlement. This means that a foundation of lasting peace is being laid. Building upon this foundation, the businesses that we have started incubating will contribute to making those communities resilient and hopeful for the present and the future. **99**
